A resident talks about his experience at A&E.

"I went to A&E last Tuesday following a massive loss of blood through vomiting. I was very quickly dealt with by the nurse who did a number of tests before I was taken to resus. All of this happened within a maximum of half an hour from my arrival.

I believe that some people are left waiting in A&E for long periods of time and then complain. If you choose to use this as a walk in clinic for minor illness and injuries you should expect to wait, or better still use a minor injuries centre or call 111 to establish if you are actually an A&E case.

My experience in resus was unbelievable. I was looked after so well even though they were very busy and I believe that other people were in there needed help more than I did.
